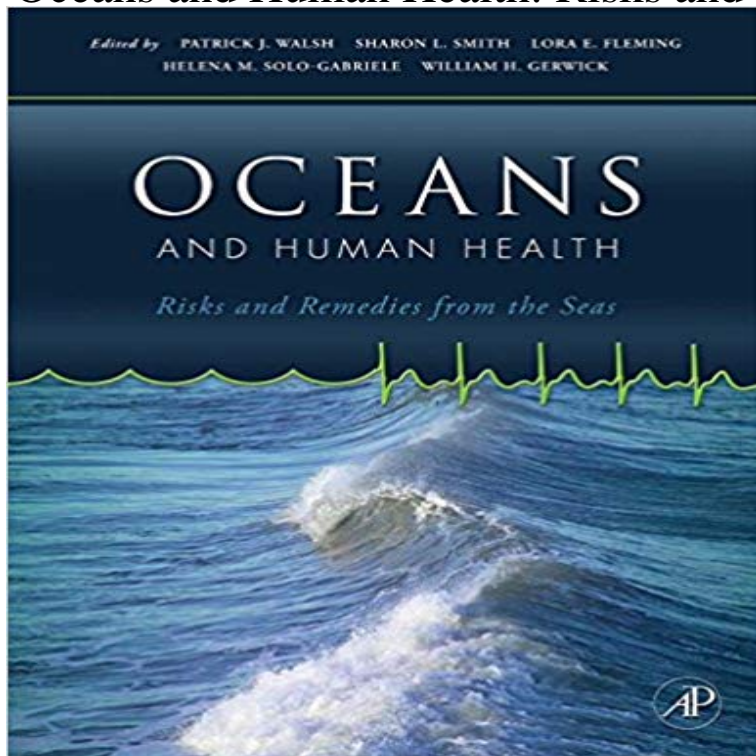


## Oceans and Human Health: Risks and Remedies from the Seas
